Frank Uekoetter studied history, political science and the social sciences at the universities of Freiburg and Bielefeld, the Johns Hopkins University in Baltimore and Carnegie Mellon University in Pittsburgh. He received his PhD from Bielefeld University in 2001. In 2002, he organized the conference “Nature Protection in Nazi Germany” under the auspices of the German Minister for the Environment Jürgen Trittin. He was a research assistant with the History Department of Bielefeld University from 2003 to 2006. Since then, he is a Dilthey Fellow with the Research Institute of the Deutsches Museum in Munich, where he works on a history of agricultural knowledge. He received his habilitation from Bielefeld University in 2009.
